This may be a first. I am sitting at a computer station in a hotel business center in Santee, South Carolina sending love and Happy Thanksgiving wishes back home to my family and friends. I can never remember being away from home during Thanksgiving, and I must admit it feels strange to be numbered among the millions who are traveling the roads this holiday season. It is a blessing to be able to travel and visit with Dottie's Aunt Madeline in Tampa, Florida for a couple of days, but rest assured HOME is never far from our thoughts!

I want to share something with you that makes me so proud to be your pastor. Yesterday at the close of our service I introduced you to a gentleman named Frank, who had first appeared at our church two weeks ago, looking for a place to worship. When he walked into our Sunday School class that Sunday, he carried with him most of his belongings, save a sleeping bag and a tarp. As he sat and opened his Bible with us, and contributed to our conversation about our obedience to God, we sensed something different about this visitor, a stranger from the streets. Frank is homeless, and has been for 7+ years and spends his nights under the awning of God's great creation, or a bridge overpass, according to the weather. In his quiet humility, he asked for nothing, and simply enjoyed worshipping with us. He came back this past Wednesday night during our quarterly church conference, and I directed him to a Bible study class going on upstairs. Taking a moment to ask if there was anything he needed, he indicated he could use a sleeping bag if anyone had an extra they were not using. (Note: He never asked for one; I asked him). His "home" had been destroyed by the weather, and he was needing an extra layer of warmth for the night. The weather forecast for that night and the day ahead were for cold temperatures and an abundance of rain. What church could possibly send him back out into that cold night? Not this one! We put Frank up in the local motel for several nights, offering warmth and rest for him, as well as providing food for his nourishment. Others from FBC met up with him in the days after to secure better shoes and clothing, a tent, and other traveling necessities. Your generosity does not end there! At the close of the service today your love offering put hope in his pocket! Thanks be to God for the outpouring of His love, on, and through, this congregation. Frank will be leaving town this morning on his way south, to warmer climates. We may never see him again this side of heaven, but I believe with all my heart, that somehow and for some reason God sent Frank our way – not just so we could help him but that he might help transform us! A tear rolls off my cheek as I think about how our hearts have been stirred through all of this! What an awesome God we serve!!

Praise the Lord for the 229 shoe boxes we packed and shipped to Operation Christmas Child. It is noted that as many as nine people may be touched by the placing of one shoe box into the hands of a child. That is 2,061 more people affected by your generosity and obedience. There are more opportunities to minister to others during the holidays as well. Please look for ways to help adopt a family through the TRBA Christmas Family Ministry. We have about nine families that need some love this Christmas. Make me proud again! Thank you in advance for what you are going to do.
